Please join us in sending the attachetter to the Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor, Health and Human Services deducation (LHHS) requesting \$11.5 million in funding for military-civilian trauma partnerships which benefits our servicemembers as well as our civilian population.

As you may know, the MISSIONe Act, the Military Injury Surgical Systems Integrated Operationally Nationwide to Achieve Preventable Death Sct, was authorized in Pandenic and All-Hazards Preparedness and Ancing Innovation Act 2019 (PAHPAI) and provides grant funding to civilian trauma centers to train and incorporate military trauma care providers and teams into these critical care centers. The MISSION Zero provision in PAHPAI authorized \$11.5 million for each of fiscal years 2019 through 2023, but unfortunately, this initiative has gone unfunded for the last three years. These miditalian partnerships will allow military trauma care teams and providers to gain exposure treating critically injured patients while alsoincreaing readiness for when these units deeployed.
